What level of IB courses does ASCIS offer?

All courses are available at SL (standard level) and HL (higher level). Ab initio is also available for language B.

What are the requirements for an IB class?

Each IB course requires in-depth knowledge of that subject. Scores are out of 7 for each subject, with a passing grade of 4. In addition to a world wide examination, students must also complete an IA (Internal Assessment) for each subject.

Can I take IB certificates for individual courses?

Yes! Students may write exams in subjects of their choice during their last two years of high school at ASCIS. Students are not required to complete the core components of TOK, EE or CAS when doing certificates. To receive a certificate for an IB course a student must earn a combined score of 4 (out of 7) for all the assessments in the course.

Are you Interested in the IB diploma at ASCIS?

- Students take one course in each group during their last two years of high school. Grade 9 and 10 ASCIS courses prepare students for IB opportunity in grade 11 and 12.
- Students complete all 3 components of the core (TOK, EE and CAS) over the two year program.
- To obtain the diploma, students must complete CAS, pass both the EE and TOK essays and receive a combined score on their exams of at least 24 points.
