OSSD REQUIREMENTS

The OSSD is changing. What is needed?

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What you need to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma depends on the year you started Grade 9.

If you started Grade 9 in 2023 or in prior years, you must earn:

• 18 compulsory credits, 12 optional credits, the literacy requirement, at least 2 online learning credits

If you started Grade 9 in 2024 or in later years you must earn:

- 17 compulsory credits, 13 optional credits, the literacy requirement, at least 2 online learning credits
- Everyone needs 40 hours of community involvement activities (volunteering) to get their high school diploma.

If you started Grade 9 in or before Fall 2023:

You need the following 18 compulsory credits to get your OSSD:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (at least 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 3 credits for group 1, 2 and 3 courses (1 credit in each group)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in Canadian history (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics and citizenship

Group 1, 2 and 3 compulsory credits

Of the 18 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from each of the following groups:

Group 1

- English (including the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course) or French as a second language
- Native languages. First Nations, Métis, and Inuit studies
- classical studies and international languages
- social sciences and the humanities
- Canadian and world studies. guidance and career education
- cooperative education, American Sign Language as a second language
- Langue des signes québécoise langue seconde

Group 2

- health and physical education, the arts
- business studies, French as a second language
- cooperative education, American Sign Language as a second language
- Langue des signes québécoise langue seconde

Group 3

- science (Grade 11 or 12), technological education
- French as a second language, computer studies
- cooperative education, American Sign Language as a second language
- Langue des signes québécoise langue seconde

If you started Grade 9 in Fall 2024 and after:

You need the following 17 compulsory credits to get your OSSD:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (Grade 9, Grade 10 and 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in science
- <u>1 credit in technological education</u> (Grade 9 or Grade 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian history (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics and citizenship
- 1 credit from the <u>STEM-related course group</u>

STEM-related course group

Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from the following group:

- business studies
- computer studies
- cooperative education
- mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)

• technological education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required) Optional credits

You must earn 13 optional credits by successfully completing courses from your school's program and course calendar.

ASCIS students complete a vast number of compulsory credits in their grade 9 and 10 years.

Students who arrive from outside of Ontario with completed years of high school:

- Student must complete 10 hours per year of high school at ASCIS and not the full 40 hours
- Students are granted credits for their years of school completed which will satisfy compulsory credit requirements of the OSSD including online learning requirements
